Modifiers: "Hardly" (adverb modifying "understand").

Explanation: "Hardly" indicates the degree of understanding.

d) S+V+O+C Pattern: The manager considered the proposal innovative.

Explanation: Subject (The manager) + Verb (considered) + Object (the proposal) + Complement (innovative).

e) Compound Sentence with 'but': The project deadline is tomorrow, but the team needs more time to complete it.

Explanation: Two independent clauses joined by "but."

 - a) Sentence: Whose wallet was left in the conference hall?

Interrogative Pronoun: "Whose"

Explanation: "Whose" is a possessive interrogative pronoun asking about ownership.

b) Sentence: The kids in the school are very cheerful.

Subject: The kids in the school

Predicate: are very cheerful

Explanation: The subject is who performs the action; the predicate describes the action or state.

c) Complex Sentence with Subject 'He': Although he was tired, he completed the report before the deadline.

Explanation: Contains a dependent clause ("Although he was tired") and an independent clause.

d) Sentence: She offered me a gift.

Pattern: S+V+IO+DO (Subject + Verb + Indirect Object + Direct Object)

Explanation: She (S) offered (V) me (IO) a gift (DO).

e) Active: Did anybody attend the meeting?

Passive: Was the meeting attended by anybody?

Explanation: Interrogative passive voice uses "Was + subject + past participle."

Overall, her portrayal compels reflection on sustainability, making her argument impactful.
